
Kevin Donovan has won three National Newspaper Awards,

WOMEN IN AIR FORCE BLUE Guest Speaker: Malcolm Kelly

Journalist and writer, Malcolm Kelly, presents the war from the perspective of the women who fought with the Women's Auxiliary Air Force (RAF) and the Royal Canadian Air Force Women's Division (RCAF). Through storytelling, photos and videos, he traces the influence that two super stars of 1930s aviation had on the women who enlisted.

During his 40-year career, Malcolm has worked for CBCSports.ca, the National Post, Canadian Press, Ottawa Citizen, and Southam News. He is the author of *SPROG: A novel of Bomber Command*, that tells of kids training in Canada during 1941-1942 for the RCAF. He is a recipient of the Governor General's Award for community service; the founder, coordinator, and a Professor in the Graduate Sports Journalism program at Centennial College in Toronto. The son of two Second World War veterans, Malcolm Kelly's main interest lies in the human stories of those in combat.



HARVEST

This old farm house was built with lime stone and roofed with local slate Sitting square with lots of rooms, just down the lane behind the cattle gate. It has seen the birth of generations and watched them come and go. They worked the land in summers and snuggled warm from the winter snow.

The pioneers who built this house, after the log cabin had had its day Put down solid roots and cleared the fields; they were here and plan to stay. They laid a barn foundation with stones from the fields out on the farm To house the horse and cattle that would keep them away from harm.

They framed the barn with timbers cut from the fields that now grow crops So the neighbours came for a barn rising and pulled out all the stops. Harvest times kept changing as the years went swiftly by. And the field hands now use equipment and no longer need the scythe.

The binding machine cuts the grain into bundles that are stood on end to dry. The sheafs sit out there for a week or two under the open sky. The annual harvest is called a thrashing and neighbours come to farm; They load the grain on hay wagons and take it to the barn.

A mighty steam engine sits connected to a thrasher, by a composite driving belt. The sheafs of grain are thrown into the thrashers chute and move at quite the pelt. The sound is quite deafening as the wheat is getting bashed And the whole thing is mind blowing, as the crops are being thrashed.


The grain is sent to a bagging area for storage in the barn, While the straw gets blown in one big pile, for use later on the farm. While all this is going on the ladies get ready to feed those working hands And when all of this is over, there is a hush and it's quiet across the lands.

MEMBERS' CORNER MAUREEN'S CAMERA RAMBLES

SEABIRDS OF NEWFOUNDLAND

Being on the coastal edge of the continent, ringed by rocky islands, predator-free and conveniently surrounded by an abundance of fish, the coast of Newfoundland is a sea bird paradise!

The Bonavista Peninsula is one of the few places in North America where you can get up close to a puffin colony without a boat. We just had to walk a few minutes to a cliffside overlooking a large nesting colony of these pigeon-sized birds as well as a few species of gulls and other seabirds. Then a few days later we cruised around the Witless Bay Ecological Reserve. Apparently, the rocky islands in this bay are home to the largest colony of puffins in North America. They were everywhere! In the water, in the air and nesting on the islands. But it was the huge colonies of penguin-like Murres that amazed me! In some spots there was hardly space between one nesting bird and the next. In addition, Black legged Kittiwake nests lined many of the cliffs. On your next trip to Newfoundland, be sure to include a seabird tour!



MEMBERS' CORNER RECIPES OF THE MONTH

BEST TURKEY SOUP



2 chicken bouillon cubes such as *Go Bio*2 tablespoons tomato paste
8 cups water, boiled
1 turkey carcass and giblets
1 medium onion, cut in half
4 - 6 celery ribs, diced
3 or 4 carrots, diced
2 parsnips, diced
Carton (946 ml) chicken bone broth such as *Imagine*4 tablespoons dried parsley
3 tablespoons dried dill
1 tablespoon celery seed
Salt & pepper to taste

- 1. Place crumbled bouillon cubes & tomato paste in a stockpot. Stir in boiled water.
- 2. Add turkey carcass, giblets, vegetables and broth.
- 3. Bring to a boil, removing the scum and fat.
- 4. Add herbs and seasonings and simmer for two hours.
- 5. Remove onion (if desired) & carcass. Serve with leftover turkey, noodles, rice or barley. **Note:** For chicken soup, replace turkey carcass with raw chicken, including skin & bones.



LEFTOVER TURKEY/CHICKEN POT PIE


- 2 frozen deep dish pie crusts
- 2 medium potatoes, peeled and diced
- 3 carrots, cut into 1-inch slices
- 1 medium onion, diced
- 2 celery ribs, diced
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 6 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 4 cups chicken or turkey broth
- 2 4 cups cubed cooked turkey or chicken
- 1 cup frozen peas/corn
- ¹/₂ cup half and half milk or cream
- 2 tablespoons dried parsley
- 1 teaspoon garlic salt or more to taste
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper

³/₄ teaspoon poultry seasoning/thyme

- 1. Preheat oven to 375°.
- 2. In a large pot, sauté potatoes, carrots, onion and celery in butter and oil until tender.
- 3. Stir in flour, gradually adding broth. Bring to a boil; cook and stir until thickened.
- 4. Add turkey or chicken, frozen peas, milk/cream, parsley and seasonings.
- 5. Place a pie crust in bottom of baking dish and add the turkey mixture.
- 6. Add top crust and cut several slits. Bake until golden brown, about 40-45 minutes.
- Let rest 10 minutes before cutting.
 Note: For "shepherd's pie", instead of pie crusts, top with mashed potatoes.


